Come for all of the time or part of the time but please just come. The support of the community is essential to preserving the quality of Cincinnati.

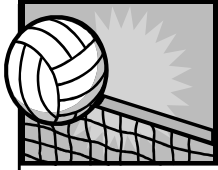

Thank you to the many community volunteers who come to North Avondale Montessori School to help tutor students in math and reading. You are helping to make a huge difference in a child's academic success. We are gearing up for the Ohio Achievement Test which will be during the week of April 28th.

We will soon be in the process of packing to move to our swing space on Glenwood Avenue (presently Burton Elementary). The district's tentative moving date of the contents will be July 21. Then the staff will be very busy getting classrooms ready for the beginning of the 2008-09 school year. In January, 2009 you will begin to see lots of activity around 615 Clinton Springs as the demolition and the building of the new North Avondale Montessori School begins. We are scheduled to return to the new building at the beginning of the August 2010 school year. I will keep you updated throughout this process.

The last day for students will be May 28th for the '07-'08 year. Burton School will close then and the building at 876 Glenwood will be used by North Avondale Montessori for about 2 years until their new building is finished. The neighborhood school for North Avondale and for some in Avondale will then be South Avondale School. Rockdale School will serve the other children in Avondale. All these children are eligible to apply to North Avondale. It has already taken place for this year.

We all need to speak up about the poor learning that is occurring in our neighborhood schools. Passing the levee did not fix this. There is a direct relationship between what poor children are learning and the social ills and crime in our neighborhood.

South Avondale has been in School Improvement for 6 years and Rockdale for 5 years. To be in the first year of school improvement a school must have been in academic emergency for 2 years. This translates to 8 and 7 years in academic emergency. We must demand better. These children can and do learn when taught by effective teachers.

As communities, Avondale and North Avondale together, we must hold all who are paid by our taxes to educate our children, accountable for the results. The benchmark results for the 4 elementary schools presently in our community are available at the NANA and Avondale Community Council meetings.

In the late Victorian era, North Avondale was famed as a beautiful suburb where “the homes of Cincinnati’s merchant princes and millionaires are found...elegant cottages, tasteful villas, and substantial mansions” (Zane Miller, *Boss Cox’s Cincinnati*).

Leading architects were hired to create splendid residences in fashionable styles of the day. By 1874, financially the village ranked higher than all the city’s other suburbs except Clifton.

This year’s “Upstairs, Downstairs” tour will feature six exceptional homes in a variety of styles, including Normandy Manor, Tudor Revival and Craftsman. Most of the homes have never been open to the public before. One of the star attractions will be the “Cantaloupe King Mansion” on Betula Avenue, which is listed in the National Register of Historic Places. No expense was spared in the construction of this magnificent home, built for a former pushcart vendor who made a fortune shipping fresh produce. The tour will also include a rare first-hand look at The Belvedere, one of the city’s first luxury high-rises. Tour goers can visit one of the condo units, the dazzling lobby, and the roof top garden.

We have wonderful dogs living in North Avondale but everyone doesn't love your **dog barking or running on their property or public spaces and leaving behind their waste**. Some people are afraid of dogs. Some people can't sit outdoors because your dog keeps barking. They are awoken out of a sound sleep because your dog is barking. Bring your dog in quickly. **Please be a good neighbor and keep your dog indoors (a dog kept indoors is more threatening to an intruder)**, always cleanup after your dog, use a leash and keep your dog secured when in your own yard. We have the following City Ordinances:

701-27. Loud Dog No person shall harbor or keep any animal of the **dog** kind which by loud and frequent or habitual barking or yelping shall cause serious annoyance or disturbance to the neighborhood

701-2. Leash Required The owner or harbinger of a harmless **dog**, not on the premises or in a motor vehicle, shall keep said **dog** on a leash of such length to keep the **dog** from annoying others. A harmless **dog** may be unleashed if either of the following is applicable: a. The **dog** is in training, a competition, or show or b. The **dog** is on property with the permission of the property owner.

701-30. Dog Excrement Removal No person shall allow a **dog** under his or her control to be upon public property or upon the property of another, absent the consent of the owner or occupant of the property, without some device for the removal and containment of such dog's excrement; nor shall any person fail to remove any excrement deposited by any **dog** under his or her control on public or private property.

701-33. Animals or Fowl Damaging Gardens and Lawns. No person owning or harboring one or more **cats, dogs,** other animals or fowl shall permit such **cats, dogs,** other animals or fowl to run at large so as to do damage to gardens, lawns, shrubbery or other private property.

701-4. Dangerous Dog to be Properly Confined or Leashed The owner or harbinger of a dangerous **dog** shall keep said **dog**:

- a. When outdoors and on the premises in a securely fenced area or on a leash controlled by a competent adult
- b. When not on the premises, securely restrained with a leash, not exceeding six feet in length, and under the control of a competent adult.
