They help control deer, rat, and feral cat population. There is only 1 recorded of a coyote attacking a human in Ohio. The animal had rabies. If you are capable, it is best to stand your ground, make yourself “big” and “loud” to intimidate them. Only do this if you are giving the coyote a way to escape, don’t do it if they are cornered.
