NSP 2010 FUNDING - HOPEFULLY!

Hope NANA will receive NSP (Neighborhood Support Program) funds of \$7,000 next year. The NSP funds support projects and activities that enhance the quality of life in our neighborhood. In case the city funds this program we have been asked to submit our proposal.

The categories in which we place our projects & activities are: Newsletter; Clean-up & Beautification; Land Development & Improvement; Environmental Affairs; Law Enforcement & Safety; Membership; and Seniors & Youth Projects. AROUND THE NEIGHBORHOOD



- Did you notice all the ugly signs that keep popping up on the utility poles? Did you know it is illegal? The Cincinnati Municipal Code states in section 911-17. **Posting Bills on Streets:** no person shall post or affix to any pole or other structure on any street, avenue, alley, park or public ground of the city, any handbill, card, circular or other printed material.
- Whoever violates this section shall be guilty of posting bills on streets, a minor misdemeanor
- Unfortunately, a police officer must witness the offense taking place to prosecute. Therefore, if we all take them down as soon as they go up, call the number on the sign and tell them to not place signs in our neighborhood (Asmann to Glenwood, Victory to Vine) and call the police if you see someone in the process of putting them up, we can nip it in the bud. So if you are out and about help by taking them down.



•Under the City Municipal Code, raking leaves into the street or right-of-way is prohibited and is PUNISHABLE BY LAW.

- Please compost yard waste at home whenever possible. Though yard waste collection is no longer separately funded it is still collected with your regular trash collection. It is no longer necessary to separate it from the rest of your trash or put in special bags as it no longer goes to composting facilities but unfortunately goes into the land fill.
- Also this is a good time trim hedges and plants that have grown out over the sidewalks making it difficult to walk safely and easily.



DID YOU KNOW WE HAVE DEER & COYOTES IN NORTH AVONDALE?

Comments from neighbors:



- We had a dogwood "attacked" -- some branches down and bark scraped -- and a hydrangea absolutely decimated. We believed it was deer (based on the imprints in the surrounding mulch)
- I had 3 large bucks with racks in my front yard. I'd imagine that they could do serious harm to any tree, young or mature, as they were very active (bucking and fighting).
- There are 3 bucks (with huge antlers) living in the Quaker woods. I have them in my backyard and see them roam the neighborhood.
- As we know we are plagued by deer and they are quite destructive. However, I just found out that the police in St. Bernard issued an all point bulletin saying that there are coyotes in the town. I am glad that we are getting some predator for the deer but coyotes unfortunately are not fussy and won't stop at deer.
- Our yard backs up to Nature Trail and you can hear the coyotes howling at night.

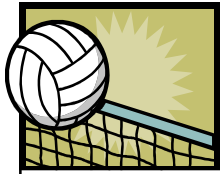
