Big Picture:

City is moving in a good direction; lots of renovation, companies moving here East side is booming; Westside could see development in the future

Jobs – triple the funding for CAA, Cincinnati Works, Easter Seals, Urban League, etc. **Poverty** – reduce childhood poverty by 5%.

Safety – needs greatest improvement. Hired 100 cops since he was elected. Wants to fix the roads. Provided new leadership in the Police Dept. Metrics are used to Revived partnering center – need to address

Inclusion – 2% businesses going to minority business. Pledged to quadruple minority and women owned business in two years. We need to expand black middle class and Hispanic groups

Finance/Customer Service – S&P/Moody's had reduced our rating. Balanced budget and created Office of Performance Analytics. Customer service is now an important goal for the city.

Ways to partner with neighborhoods to partner with the neighborhoods to improve quality of life.

Q & A with the Mayor

Aggregation of services – city can aggregate for customers (Duke) or find another vendor.

MSD and the City residue is burned in an incinerator; other stuff is placed in the river. Trucking the crap is \$2.5m/year. Keep Little Miami incinerator open so we won't have to truck the "crap" through the city.

Chronic nuisance law – repealed before he was sworn in. Trying to figure out how to resurrect the code.

Police report—Officer Hamann — 3652 Reading TTW — continue to build a case of misconduct inside the building. Captain Paul Broxterman — new captain/commander of District 4 been here 27 yrs.

Blake Brown – NA Rec Center - # attending after school camp is up 35%. Focus is on 50+ age group. Currently working with a 3-month calendar. Wants to spruce up the lobby furniture. Fridays, the Rec Center is open until 9:00 p.m. Recreation is not in favor of staying open that late.

Committee reports:

The city is in the process of trying to declare the home located at 3864 Reading Rd. condemned.
