



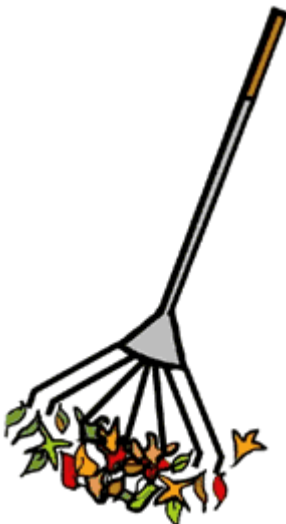
Around the Neighborhood: November 2020

**REMINDER CONCERNING RAKING LEAVES**
