CINCINNATI WATER WORKS LEAD SERVICE LINE REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

In 2017 the Cincinnati City Council established a Lead Service Line Replacement Program. Private home owners were to share the replacement cost with GCWW. Since the December 15, 2021 program change, the entire cost of replacing the lead water pipe is now borne exclusively by the GCWW. Did you pay to have the lead service pipe replaced in your home between 2017 and December 15, 2021? Did you pay when the work was completed or was the amount added to your property tax?
