Free meal boxes available Mondays at select Library locations

The free boxes contain seven dinner meals and seven snacks. All items are shelf stable and ready to eat, with no refrigeration or additional preparation required.

This program is open to all youth, up to age 18, and young adults ages 19-21 who are following Individualized Education Programs. For more information about eligibility, visit cincinnatilibrary.org/meals. Children do not need to be present when picking up meals. Parents or caregivers may pick up meal boxes for their children.

Many branches of the Cincinnati and Hamilton County library system have a part time Homework Help and Enrichment Support, including the St. Bernard Branch

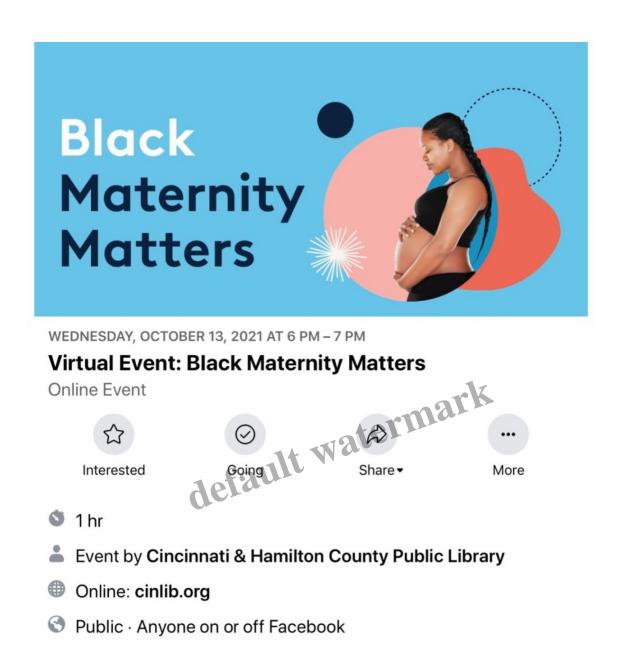
