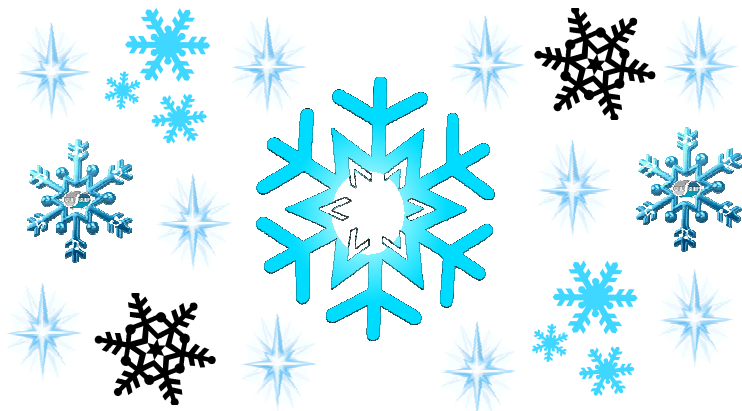
Southern Gateway Chorus

His time and his commitment creates the beauty we reap as a community. When I met Richard, I toured his garden and loved his choice of plants, the placement of the plants and the flow of color and texture. Seeing his garden inspired me to take on my own yard.

Mary Piper also needs to be recognized for all of her work on Asmann Avenue and the beds she maintains on Victory Parkway and Dana Avenue. Mary has a love of native flowers. The native Asters burst blue in the fall and the native wildflowers burst yellow during the summer. Many native white flowers are along the Asmann Avenue flower bed. The beauty of flowers is everlasting.

Everyone, I also want you to stop and take notice of the cleanup at the Marion Avenue Triangle on the bend at Clinton Springs along the walkway.

It's hard to think of spring already but NANA and NABA need donations for our flower pots that flank Reading Road. This program is through the Cincinnati Parks. We pay for 3 or 4 plantings per year and they maintain and plant all of the pots. Our cost has been \$250.00/pot in recent years. I thank everyone who has supported the efforts in our neighborhood to keep our neighborhood Cincinnati's Best Address, but we need new people to donate so that the responsibility doesn't always fall on shoulders of the same people year after year.

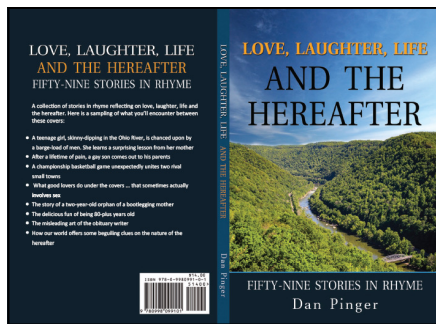
Longtime North Avondale resident **Dan Pinger (formerly of Red Bud Avenue**, now a resident of Ripley, Ohio) has just published his first book, at the age of 86.

Dan Pinger has played many roles in his long and eventful life. He raises horses. He served in the U.S. Army. He was a notably indifferent law school student. As a newspaper reporter he covered the wild and woolly days when the Mob ran Newport, Kentucky. Dan



also spent some time in academia, working as an administrator at the University of Cincinnati. But it wasn't until he turned 50 that he discovered his true calling, when he founded the Dan Pinger Public Relations agency. Dan Pinger and the hundreds of "Pingerites" who worked with him offered communications counsel to clients across Cincinnati, Ohio and the nation for more than 25 years. He always said those were the most emotionally rewarding years of his career. And of course, Dan has been a son, husband, father, grandfather and lover, living through all the joy and heartbreak those roles bring. Now, in his 80s, Dan has begun scribbling some poems that deal with love, personal and business tribulations, and an 86-year-old man's consideration of what comes next. Love, Laughter, Life and the Hereafter: Fifty-Nine Stories in Rhyme is his first compilation of poetry.

Delving into themes that range from relationships and regrets to world peace and pets, this revealing and candid collection of 59 stories in rhyme will enlighten and inspire. Some of these stories are true. Some of them are nearly true. Some are works of imagination, but grounded so much in the real world that they seem like they must be true. All of them are fiercely honest, from the observant and thoughtful perspective of an 86-year-old.

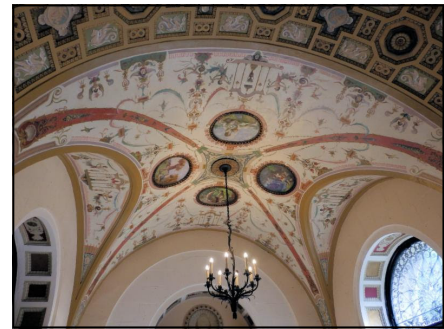

2016 Preservation Awards Honor Craftsmanship, Rehabilitation and Sustainability

Cincinnati Preservation Association (CPA) presented 15 awards for local preservation excellence at its 52nd annual meeting on Sunday, November 13, 2016, at Pinecroft, the historic mansion of Powel Crosley, Jr. Two awards were in our neighborhood!

Belvedere Lobby Restoration: The exquisite painted finishes of the Belvedere Condominium lobby in North Avondale, including 12 oval-framed paintings by Cincinnati painter Herman Wessels, have been restored to their original splendor by Kris Lemmon of Deco Works.



Marion Hall: Built in late 1890s for auto dealer Frank Enger, this grand Beaux Arts Classical-style palazzo in North Avondale was later used by Xavier University as an honors dorm for male students. A top-to-bottom restoration by **Ryan Messer and James Musuraca** has restored the house and grounds to their original glory.



IN MEMORIAM

☛ **Rick Steiner**, who grew up and kept his office on **Rose Hill**, did make it in New York, but he knew he could make it anywhere. As a Broadway producer, he made millions in the city, but stayed here in Cincinnati. Frank Sinatra be damned.



In addition to Mr. Steiner's work on Broadway, he was a limited partner and sat on the ownership bench of the Cincinnati Reds. He also sat on the boards of the Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park, Ensemble Theatre Cincinnati and the Cincinnati School for Creative and Performing Arts. He died Thursday, November 3. It was five days before his 70th birthday.

Mr. Steiner was born in **North Avondale** and graduated from Walnut Hills High School in 1964. He continued his education at the University of Wisconsin and received his MBA from the University of Chicago in 1970.

He then went from Boston, where he worked with then-unknown Chevy Chase, to New York. After a stint in marketing, he traveled the country selling custom T-shirts at fairs and then came back to Cincinnati to work as a stockbroker.

According to a 2008 Enquirer profile on Mr. Steiner, the son of a Kenner Toys founder could have taken a job at the company, but wanted to find his own way. Eventually, he made his way back to New York as a producer of "Big River." After a bold move lobbying the Tony Awards with a \$500,000 ad in the New York Times, his show got noticed and went on to win seven Tonys in 1985.

In the past 30 years, Mr. Steiner co-produced 11 Broadway musicals. Four won the Tony for Best Musical. After "Big River" came "The Producers" in 2001, "Hairspray" in 2003 and "Jersey Boys" in 2006. He coproduced the Pulitzer Prize-winning play "Topdog/Underdog" in 2001. His other notable productions include "Into The Woods" and "The Secret Garden," and his certified flops, his family said, were "The Times They are A-Changin'" and "A Catered Affair."

Survivors include Jan Steiner, the mother of his sons Ace and Duke Steiner, and Jan's daughter Jaelyn; a brother, Corky Steiner; and nieces and nephews.

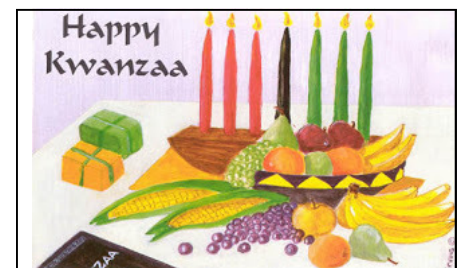

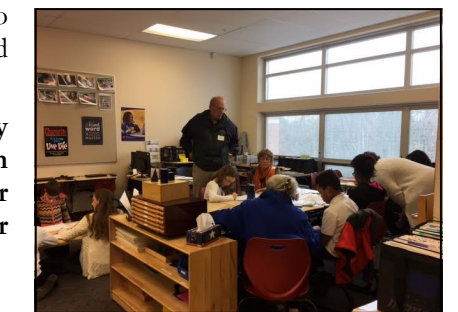
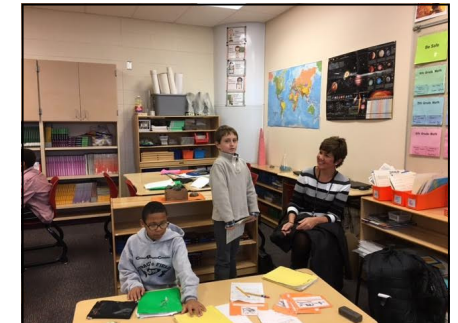
feedback our program has been very positive and we look forward to the 2017," said Principal Lewis.

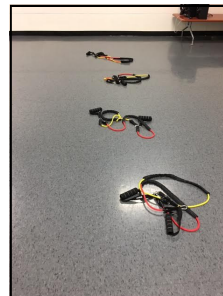
