NSP 2019

NANA receives City money through the **Neighborhood Support Program (NSP)** for projects and activities that enhance the quality of life in our neighborhood. For 2019, NANA has the potential to receive \$6.085 which we will divide into two categories.

The categories for our projects and activities are: **Membership & Communication** (Database, Email, Connections, Membership Events & Outreach, NANA News,



THE CITY AND OTHER NONPROFITS

The Metropolitan Sewer District of Greater Cincinnati (MSD) would like to inform you of its annual public hearing before the Hamilton County Board of County Commissioners (BoCC) to consider its proposed 2019 Operating Budget and proposed 2019 -2023 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) budget.

The BoCC is holding two public hearings at the County Administration Building, 138 East Court Street, Room 603, Cincinnati, Ohio 45202:

Wednesday, December 5, 2018 at 11:30 a.m. Wednesday, December 19, 2018 at 11:30 a.m.

MSD's annual operating and CIP budgets are developed and recommended by MSD to the BoCC each year. MSD is not proposing a sewer rate increase for 2019.

The Operating budget reflects the funding needed to support MSD's operation of its collection and treatment system and the personnel and non-personnel costs to run MSD 24/7/365.

The CIP budget includes capital items like new sewers, upgrades to treatment plants and other assets to keep the sewer system in good, working condition and projects mandated by a federal Consent Decree.

Together, these budgets ensure full compliance with all regulatory requirements as well as protect public health and the environment throughout Hamilton County.


