# THE BELVEDERE AND MITCHELL TRIANGLE PARK LANDSCAPING PROJECT

The Belvedere Condominium Association contracted DBM Landscaping Co. to landscape and beautify Mitchell Triangle Park and the Belvedere's beds. The landscape design includes the edging and mulching of all beds and the beds around the trees on the south side of the park are combined and mulched to form a WC for dogs which will help with keeping the lawn in proper condition. A rose bed is planted along the old stone wall. This rose bed flows into a flower bed containing Buddleias, Hydrangeas, Lilacs and other perennials. A small natural stone wall is built on both sides of the stairs at the corner of Clinton Springs and Rose Hill. This wall will prevent mulch and soil from flowing on to the sidewalk during rainy seasons, and improve the aesthetics and visibility of the corner. The beds on both sides of the stairs are lined with Green Velvet Boxwoods and are planted with White Dogwood trees, Oakleaf, and endless Summer Hydrangeas. A similar wall of natural stone is built in the middle of the park to support a bed that is lined with endless Summer Hydrangeas and Green Velvet Boxwoods. The east entrance to the park from Rose Hill Avenue is edged with a wrought iron fence. Green Velvet Boxwoods line this entrance, and is flanked with two Pink Diamond Hydrangeas. The Mitchell Triangle Park sign was painted by the Cincinnati Park Board and the gas light posts that are adjacent to the park were painted by the Belvedere Condominium Association. The Belvedere's front and south beds have plantings similar to those in the park.

Studies show that beautification reduces the amount of litter and crime, increases property values and gives citizens a better quality of life. We hope that you enjoy our efforts to improve the beauty of our neighborhood and with your support we are able to keep Mitchell Triangle Park a beautiful place to visit.

While we cannot duplicate that grant, we could choose a fruit or vegetable and make samples for each child. This could be done at the convenience of the preparer and it could let them know what the food tastes like and perhaps how it might be used. The preparer could arrange to bring it over to the class or have someone else do this. Are you interested in being involved in this teaching experience?

We will continue with this class next year. Tutors are always needed. Whatever your time and whatever your talent the children will appreciate it. A donation of supplies can always be used. The next newsletter will have a list of supplies for the next school year.
