

AROUND THE NEIGHBORHOOD

Earlier this year, Ron & Judie Pennington, long time North Avondale residents, reached out to City Council about the poor condition of many of the gas lamps in North Avondale. The pedestrian character of a neighborhood is very important to me, and my staff immediately began working with the Penningtons and our Transportation Department on a fix. After months of dialogue, we were able to successfully get 30 of the roughly 65 gas lamps in North Avondale repaired, painted and cleaned for the first time in decades. Now, I'm committed to getting the remaining lamps painted in 2014 so all of North Avondale can shine. The repaired, repainted lamps look great and are significantly brighter since having been cleaned. We hear a lot about stories involving downtown, but for most Cincinnatians their favorite place in the City is the street they live on. I'm very happy the Penningtons brought this to our attention; this citizen-initiated problem-solving is what City Hall needs more of. You tell us what to focus onand we get it done.

Xavier Green Team Volunteers under the direction of Ann Dougherty, Sustainability Director, is designing another eco-system. When Ann presented at the NANA Annual meeting last year, we received feedback from the community including, Why don't you use your own land rather than this park? Which was a good question, so that's what we did these past 15 months. A design charrette was held in February, raised bed boxes were built in March, a hoop house was built in April, and row crops are being planted in September and October. Classes and clubs will meet in the hoop house this winter, along with growing greens. The farm has been set up across from Cintas Center. It is in the middle of the new University Station construction right now, but still has a bit of student traffic, and is called the
