#### **HEALTH & WELLNESS**

August and September of every year represent the start of school. As it is the beginning of a new academic year for children, it should also be viewed as the beginning of a new **health** year for all. So to get off on the right foot, do the following:

- 1. Schedule an appointment with your child's pediatrician. Make this an ANNUAL event.
- 2. Ask about vision screening so if glasses are needed, they can be gotten early in the year. Children can't succeed in school if their vision is impaired and sometimes poor vision is the cause of school failure and we are unaware that the eyes are the culprit!
- 3. Check with the school about requirements to participate in the school sports program. Many programs require physical exams.
- 4. Pull out the vaccination records and make sure your children are current on all required vaccinations.
- 5. The start of a new year is a good time to teach and reinforce basic safety procedures like covering coughs and proper and frequent hand washing.

Additionally there is a free patient education tool called Myhealthfinder (https://healthfinder.gov/myhealthfinder/). It is a personalized online tool that provides preventive practices and services based on your age, sex and pregnancy status in both English and Spanish. Use it and get the preventive services you need to stay healthy. Use it also to augment your conversations with your doctor or health practitioner.

All services listed above are available through Cincinnati's health centers.



Like many communities, we value all the qualities which make us the 'community' we value. Yet, like many communities in our city we're being impacted by negative incidences, everything from petty crime, to more serious happenings.

For example the owners of condo units at Rose Crest Condominiums at the corner of Clinton Springs and Mitchell Ave. have had vehicles broken into on four separate occasions just this summer. And, a number of streets had similar events.

As is the case with most of these happenings the report of an incidence gets made after the fact and with minimal detail, if any. It becomes imperative for us all to be observant; if something appears wrong assume that it is. Report it to the police immediately and don't second guess. Make note of any details you can gather, descriptions, time, and location. Is it possible to take a photo or video?

All of this includes seeing drug activity. Since most drug transactions happen in seconds, try to get car description and license plate, especially that of the dealer's vehicle. Look about. Make it a practice to occasionally look out to see what's happening in the street in front of your own and neighbor's homes.

Attend NANA meetings to keep abreast of what's happening; you'll find that the police report regularly and are open to your input to refine what they are doing. Help keep our community of North Avondale the great place it is.







## Scheduling of orange-bag recycling (for textiles, shoes, small appliances etc.)

It turns out you must in fact call (866.835.5068), a day ahead, to get these bags picked up. Instructions had said leaving them out on the curb alongside the regular recycling would work, but Simple Recycling tells me they are callahead only-- for now. They'll take things not suitable for charity: anything from worn-out shoes and ruined clothes to broken toasters and microwaves-- and save it from the landfill. Yes, they will also take good-condition items, and re-sell to thrift stores-- but it would be lazy to use them for it instead of a charity. Examples of items they take: "clothing, coats, jackets, jewelry, shoes, purses, hats, toys, pictures, mirrors, blankets, drapes, curtains, pillows, sleeping bags, small furniture, small appliances, irons, radios, lamps, hair dryers, tools, toasters, microwaves, coffee makers, silverware, dishes, pots, pans, glasses and backpacks."
