Dear Neighbors,

Exciting times continue this summer in North Avondale!

Our multi-year efforts finally paid off with great news - the blighted lot at **3916 Reading** (between Avondale Ave. & Barry Lane) is no longer owned by the previous owner. We can all celebrate as the 20-year blight is over! This past August, it was one of the first properties to be acquired through the powers of the new Land Bank, with title now with the City. NANA's Strategic Planning Committee and our North Avondale Business Association (NABA) are working closely with the City on applying for additional grants to clean up the property and to conduct a site-specific market study. Currently, utility companies' subcontractors are using the property and have promised to also improve it upon their departure in late autumn.

NANA Committees continue to make great strides.

Our Strategic Planning Committee, chaired by Rebecca Williamson held several meetings over the summer, three with potential consultants to work on the business district market study. Special thanks to the Belvedere for hosting several meetings. The attendees were very impressed with our neighborhood's historic architectural gem!

The Ecosystem Committee, chaired by Pamela Smitherman, NANA's 3rd Vice President, and lead committee member, Clare Sillett made great progress with organizing and conducting a meeting for neighbors on stormwater management issues with representatives of the Metropolitan Sewer District of Greater Cincinnati.

Congratulations to Michelle Baxter (Law and Safety Chair) and her family on their newest family addition - a beautiful baby girl, Paige. Michelle is already back on the topic of Chronic Nuisance with the City's release of a proposed procedure.

In collaboration with the NABA, NANA is considering a "Celebrate Fall Party in the Park" at Seasongood (DTBD). This event would feature the talent of our community. WOULD YOU LIKE A FREE TREE?????

CINCINNATI PARK BOARD FALL RELEAF PROGRAM 2012

TO QUALIFY:

- 1. Property must be within Cincinnati city limits.
- 2. Trees must be planted within 30 feet of the right-of-way or visible from the street. Planting between the street and sidewalk and in backyards is not acceptable.
- 3. **Plant the right tree in the right place**. Please consider the mature size of the tree. Be aware of any obstructions from wires, utilities, or other structures.

A high priority is given to planting trees on private property along streets the Park Board cannot plant due to narrow right-of-ways. The Park Board encourages such streets to coordinate delivery and planting for interested property owners.

Other priority areas include community focal points such as entranceways, street triangles, areas near street intersections, and public frontages along major streets.

Forestry staff will inspect each planting location before approving tree requests, and will inspect locations after planting to ensure guidelines are followed.




