#### Strategic Planning – Land Use Committee

##### North Avondale Business District Workshop

On Saturday, June 8, 2013, the North Avondale community hosted Interboro Partners, a Brooklyn-based urban design and planning practice, to conduct a neighborhood workshop about the future of our Business District. Held at The New School Montessori, it included about fifty participants: a mix of neighborhood residents and prospective residents, architecture, design, and urban planning students, and professionals in these fields.

The motivation for the workshop was the belief that the business district has the potential to be a vibrant, walkable

commercial center that could catalyze development in immediate and surrounding areas, but is presently not thriving. The workshop asked: What can be done to make the business district more vibrant? How can it attract more businesses and shoppers? How could existing businesses better serve their customers?

Interboro Partners conducted a series of exercises. They began by asking participants to make mental maps of the business district. Then mixed groups of residents, students, and professionals surveyed the area, documenting it with drawings, maps and photographs. Later in the day, each group conducted a Business Owner Survey and a Shopper Survey to understand who is using the district. The final exercise explored the future of the Business District.

Interboro Partners' hunch is that many things that people consider problems are really opportunities in disguise. Might there be an opportunity to develop the area in a way that works with and builds on what exists, as opposed to supplanting it in favor of something entirely new? Is there a way to leverage the North Avondale Business District's unique formal and programmatic qualities to produce something truly North Avondale-esque?

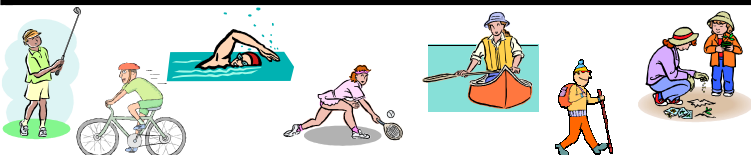
#### **Membership and Social Committee:**

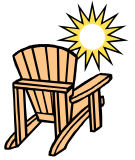
