NANA Board members submitted the Community Budget Requests for FY24/25 with the City of Cincinnati's Planning Division. The results will be announced in August of 2023. The final projects submitted North Avondale Streetscape, NA Recreation Center Playfields and Playset and a multi-modal transportation center-solar charging center, red bikes and scooters. Also, in October the City announced an extra \$85 million budget carryover. While North Avondale was not high on the priority list, the city is considering replacing the playset at the recreation center. Many other neighborhoods may receive substantial considerations for example, a 3.5-milliondollar renovation for Ziegler Park. Please contact your councilmembers and neighbors, Jan-Michelle Kearney, Meeka Owens and Chris Smitherman, (running for Hamilton County Commissioner) and ask them to support North Avondale in these and future funding requests.

The Law and Safety and Zoning committee are hard at work. Carolyn Gillman was successful in closing down the illegal group home at 970 Dana. We suspect that some of the recent house to house solicitations for money will end. In addition, the Zoning committee is busy reviewing another development, Victory Vistas, a proposed Affordable Housing Senior Living at Victory Parkway and Asmann. Chinedum Ndukwe, from Kingsley and Company, along with Paddock Hills Trustees and neighbors living near the proposed development were invited to the NANA Executive Board meeting to discuss the plans. More to come on this.

There are so many ways to get involved in our neighborhood. Please consider giving back and volunteering a few hours each month. The red dot used to be worn to show that a woman was married. Today many wear a bindi as a sign of a blessing, keeping one centered.

Another important celebration, this time from Mexican culture, is Dia de Muertos. This was presented by Karla, a New School Montessori parent who read to the children about how "Day of the Dead" is celebrated in Mexico and that it is to honor loved ones who have died yet remain in



our hearts and thoughts. The children applied colorful decorations and talked about those we remember.

Learning about our culture as a community – asking questions, tasting foods, hearing stories – brings us into a better understanding and appreciation of the diversity we value so much.

In 2017 the Cincinnati City Council established a Lead Service Line



Replacement Program. Private home owners were to share the replacement cost with GCWW. Since the December 15, 2021 program change, the entire cost of replacing the lead water pipe is now borne exclusively by the GCWW.
