#### HAMILTON COUNTY RENTAL REGISTRATION

NANA WORKS TO MAKE SURE ALL RENTAL PROPERTIES IN NORTH AVONDALE ARE REGISTERED By Michelle Baxter

A State Law effective September 29, 2006, and updated in 2007 requires that all residential rental property in Hamilton County must be registered with the County Auditor. The Residential Rental Property Registration form is available at: http://www.hcauditor.org/real\_property\_forms.asp or may be obtained by calling (513) 946.4000.

To see if a property is registered:

- go to http://www.hamiltoncountyauditor.org/
- click on Property search
- Enter the address or owner
- look for a yes or no after Rental Registration in the left column.

Rental Registration is important. It gives the City and neighbors the ability to easily find contact information on owners to hold them accountable for building/health and other city code violations as well as police and nuisance complaints This state law holds landlords accountable to insure tenant safety. The integrity of this law will protect and preserve our community. NANA requests if you are not registered, do so now as we will be following up with the Auditor to make sure our community expectations are met and owners no longer violate state law.



On December 24, 2008 an order of foreclosure was granted to US Bank Corp. against Evelyn McQueen Baskin in Case No. A 0810487 ordering the property be sold at Sheriffs sale. On March 27, 2009 Evelyn died.

On of June 8th NANA was informed by Margo Warminski, Preservation Director of the Cincinnati Preservation Association of a scheduled tag sale to be held on June 13 & 14. NANA contacted the owner of Waverly House Auctions who said that the "new" owner, Evelyn's nephew Glen Leonard had arranged the sale as he needed to get rid of the copious contents of the home as well as the windows and fixtures because he wanted to make it "green." I informed her that he did not own the house as the property had not yet gone to probate. Later that day she changed the sale to a contents only, excluding anything affixed to the building. She canceled the sale the next day. Another auction house picked up the sale as a contents only which was held without any problems. NANA with the help of attorney Charles McGinnis also contacted the Bank, their lawyers, the Police, the City and surrounding neighbors.

At the Sheriffs Sale on June 18th the property was purchased (Continued on page 3)
