



There is a misconception concerning crime in our neighborhood. This June the news media and District 4 Police Department incorrectly labeled North Avondale as having a homicide which occurred in Norwood. Later there was a rumor that an Evanston homicide occurred in NA. These tragic homicides never occurred within the boundaries of NA. This got us thinking it might be helpful to put some statistics (provided by Chris Kearney) in the *NANA NEWS*.

▪Here are the total violent crimes (murder, rape, robbery and aggravated assault) for 2010 by neighborhoods.

▪Nuisance calls were down -31% in NA which is the greatest reduction in nuisance calls of any neighborhood. We believe NANA's work with Community Driven Crime Control (CDCC), the Police and landlords has contributed to this major impact.

Hyde Park: Jan 2009 - May 2010 = 9

N. Avondale: Jan 2009 - May 2010 = 10

FED UP WITH HIGH HEATING BILLS?

Wondering what energy conservation steps in your home will give you the biggest savings? Want to make changes in your house that support more sustainable energy consumption in the United States? The Greater Cincinnati Energy Alliance (GCEA) is helping SW OH and N KY communities address these issues. Organizing is starting in North Avondale to bring the GCEA program here in the fall.

The GCEA is a non-profit organization whose goal is to help communities reduce their energy costs. The Alliance recently received a grant of \$17M from the Department of Energy to support its work. GCEA outreach includes conducting door-to-door campaigns and community workshops to explain energy savings options to home owners. They targeted Mt. Washington in May and will be in Wyoming later this month. One current use of their funds is to reduce the cost of home energy audit (which typically can cost \$400 - \$500) to \$50.
