NOTE: Trees must be planted within 30 ft of the sidewalk and visible from the street.

Depending upon demand Urban Forestry may limit number of trees to one per site or substitute species.

TO QUALIFY:



- Property must be in the City of Cincinnati.
- **2.** Trees must be planted within 30 feet of the right-of-way and visible from the street. Planting in back yards is not acceptable
- **3.** Plant the right tree in the right place. Please consider the mature size of the tree. Be aware of any obstructions from wires, utilities, or other structures.

Forestry staff will inspect each planting location before approving tree requests.

A high priority is given to planting trees on private property along streets the Park Board cannot plant due to narrow right-of -way. The Park Board would encourage neighbors on such streets to coordinate delivery and planting for interested property owners.

Other priority areas include community focal points such as entranceways, street triangles, areas near street intersections and public frontages along major streets (schools, cemeteries and church properties). Return the form by September 23, 2005 by mail or fax (861-8669).

The choices this year are:

Small

- •Kousa Dogwood (grows 15 to 20 feet tall, 15 to 20 feet spread, white flowers, dark green foliage changing to reddish purple/scarlet in fall, exfoliating bark with grey, tan, brown color, part shade/part sun but prefers full sun)
- •Robinson Crabapple (grows 15 to 25 feet tall, 15 to 20 feet spread, single crimson buds opening to deep pink flowers, dark red fruit, full sun)

Medium


- •Littleleaf Linden (grows 40 to 60 feet. tall, 35 to 50 feet spread, dark shiny green turning to yellow in fall, full sun)
- 'Norwegian Sunset' Maple (grows 30 to 35 feet tall, 20 to 25 feet spread, glossy dark green leaf turns orange-red to red in fall, full sun to part shade)

Large

- •Black Tupelo (grows 30 to 50 feet tall, 20 to 30 feet spread, part shade/part sun to full sun, brilliant display of red to deep purple in fall, most beautiful native tree).
- •London Planetree (70 to 100 feet tall, 60 to 85 feet spread, full sun to light shade, yellow-green in spring to sage green then soft brow to orangish brown, ornamental bark of creamy white to olive green)

Evergreen

•Black Hills Spruce (20 to 50 feet tall, 15 to 25 feet spread, best in full sun, evergreen)
