for donating hundreds of individual cups of assorted flavors. A special thanks to Captain Eliot Isaac, Lieutenant Randy Webb and several officers of District 4 that came out to show their appreciation and support to the dedicated COPP volunteers.

#### History of Citizens on Patrol:

First deployed in 1997 in three test neighborhoods the program has expanded into 24 of the cities 52 neighborhoods with an additional unit patrolling City Parks. Volunteers patrol their neighborhoods, acting as the eyes and ears of the police. Patrols concentrate around problem areas aiding the police by increasing visibility. COPP units deter crime by their mere presence and visibility to the general public. Using police radios and cell phones team members are able to communicate directly with officers and report crimes in progress. Much of the COPP units function however, is the reporting of quality of life issues. By locating and reporting issues that contribute to criminal activity, these teams are able to fix the proverbial "Broken Window." All members have

completed a basic class with twelve hours of class training, an 8 hour ride-a-long with a police officer and attend additional ongoing training throughout the year. Additional training is involved for being certified for driving a Citizen's on Patrol vehicle. # WOULD YOU LIKE A FREE TREE?????

## CINCINNATI PARK BOARD FALL RELEAF PROGRAM 2009

## TO QUALIFY:

- 1. Property must be in the City of Cincinnati.
- 2. Trees must be planted within 30 ft of the right-of-way and visible from the street. Planting between the street and sidewalk and in backyards is not acceptable.
- 3. Plant the right tree in the right place. Please consider the mature size of the tree. Be aware of any obstructions from wires, utilities, or other structures.

A high priority is given to planting trees on private property along streets the Park Board cannot plant due to narrow right-ofways. The Park Board encourages such streets to coordinate delivery and planting for interested property owners.

Other priority areas include community focal points such as entranceways, street triangles, areas near street intersections, and public frontages along major streets.

Forestry staff will inspect each planting location before approving tree requests, and will inspect locations after planting to ensure guidelines are followed.




