Certainly none of us want that! Properties in this condition must be given attention. If not, and the condition further deteriorates, the City for safety reasons will most likely raze the property.

NANA is exploring with several companies that do restoration and renovation work how we might bring "life" back to some of these residential properties. NANA in some type partnership with these companies <u>might</u> be one means by which this can be accomplished. In other cases private investors are considering developing certain buildings and apartment complexes into attractive and more suitable condition that will give residents better places to live and increased pride for where they live. These investors often come to the NANA Board and make presentations outlining their plans and seeking NANA support.

Also, some vacant and unkempt lots and buildings exist in North Avondale's business district. Therein lies potential development for new and community enhancement. Many ideas have been suggested for that area.... new, modern office space, a nice restaurant, a new mini-mall with specialty shops or a new multi level complex with underground parking having neat, small stores on the ground level and super, nice condos on several stories above. The wish list of nice attractions goes on and on. Some could actually become reality if we chose to use our ingenuity, imagination and have the courage to make North Avondale a "neighborhood that has it all". NANA is also exploring this type thinking with investors and companies to seek an action plan and direction for starting on this goal.

For sure, change will not happen over night and it's certain it will never happen unless we resolve to make it start. But, if it is needed for the community in which we live and raise our children, shouldn't we at least give serious consideration? Flowers do not bloom the first day the seed is planted.

The NANA Board needs your advice and comments about matters that are a concern or which would change our community. The best way for me and the other Board members to do the job you want us to do is for you to attend the NANA General Membership Meetings that are held the second Tuesday of each month. The next one is September 14^{th.} when we will also tour the new school. I look forward to seeing you there.

Litterers beware! Keep America Beautiful (KAB), in partnership with Keep Cincinnati Beautiful (KCB), has launched a new litter

prevention education campaign that calls attention to the inappropriate act of littering, and the thoughtlessness of offenders. The campaign, "Littering is Wrong Too" allows everyone to get involved in a unique way. It links littering with other wrongdoings like "networking at a funeral" or "breaking up on Valentine's Day," while also defining the personality of the litterer as a socially unaccepted jerk.

Geared at young adults, those found to be most likely to litter, the campaign entertains in order to get people talking. It kicked off a couple weeks ago and residents can expect to see and hear a lot about the problem of litter in the coming months. The ultimate goal is to change perceptions of those who litter and the act of littering, to induce a change in behavior and lead to a cleaner, more beautiful city.

KAB selected Keep Cincinnati Beautiful to pilot the litter prevention campaign in anticipation that it will be made available to other affiliates across the country. From now until October 15, the pilot campaign will be executed throughout Cincinnati and ads featuring other wrong behaviors will be visible on billboards, posters at popular bars and restaurants, online, on the radio and at events across the city. In addition to concerts and outdoor events, residents will be exposed to the campaign at select professional baseball and football games as well as local college sporting events. At these events, attendees will have an opportunity to write their own "wrongs" and showcase them in photos and videos that will be featured and voted upon on the campaign Website.

Residents will also be able to "write their wrong" online, adding their own creativity to the campaign. Throughout the pilot period, residents can compete for the "wrongest wrong" with prizes being awarded throughout the time period and a grand prize winner announced at the end of the campaign. Cincinnatians are encouraged to share their wrongs, photos and videos with friends and family through their social networks, helping generate more buzz for the problem of litter while engaging residents in a humorous way.

CINCINNATI PARK BOARD FALL RELEAF PROGRAM 2010

TO QUALIFY:

- 1. Property must be in the City of Cincinnati.
- 2. Trees must be planted within 30 ft of the right-of-way and visible from the street. Planting between the street and sidewalk and in backyards is not acceptable.
- 3. **Plant the right tree in the right place**. Please consider the mature size of the tree. Be aware of any obstructions from wires, utilities, or other structures.

A high priority is given to planting trees on private property along streets the Park Board cannot plant due to narrow right-of-ways. The Park Board encourages such streets to coordinate delivery and planting for interested property owners.

Other priority areas include community focal points such as entranceways, street triangles, areas near street intersections, and public frontages along major streets.

Forestry staff will inspect each planting location before approving tree requests, and will inspect locations after planting to ensure guidelines are followed.
