Interest from Shiloh Baptist and Avondale Youth counsel as well as others. 3-day program for 3 hours each or a 4-day program. NAACP also has a youth counsel that might be interested.

Walt Koucky – <u>Zoning</u> – Master plan update – Gabriel Couch (Abby) City planner came out to the meeting. They are close to finalizing contract with Urban Fast forward consultant. Clear focus on our business district. We may move forward in the next 6 months to 1 year.

<u>Beautification</u> – has lived here for 10 years on Warwick Ave. Working on organizing a community event around Washington Triangle. We collaborate with Cincinnati Parks regarding Seasongood. NSP fund to help with the flower pot contract. Jack Wolking offered \$500 donation to maintain Washington Triangle.

Speaker – Dan Zavon – Rank Choice Voting and Proportional Representation. Audricia Brooks introduced the speaker. Rank Choice voting was last on the ballot in 2008. The highest it has ever gotten is 47%. Plan would make for automatic run offs. Would also tend to provide more proportional representation. Cincinnati has had rank choice voting in the past but it was repealed in the 50s largely because of its success in electing minorities. Organization if rank the vote Ohio, also fair vote Ohio.
