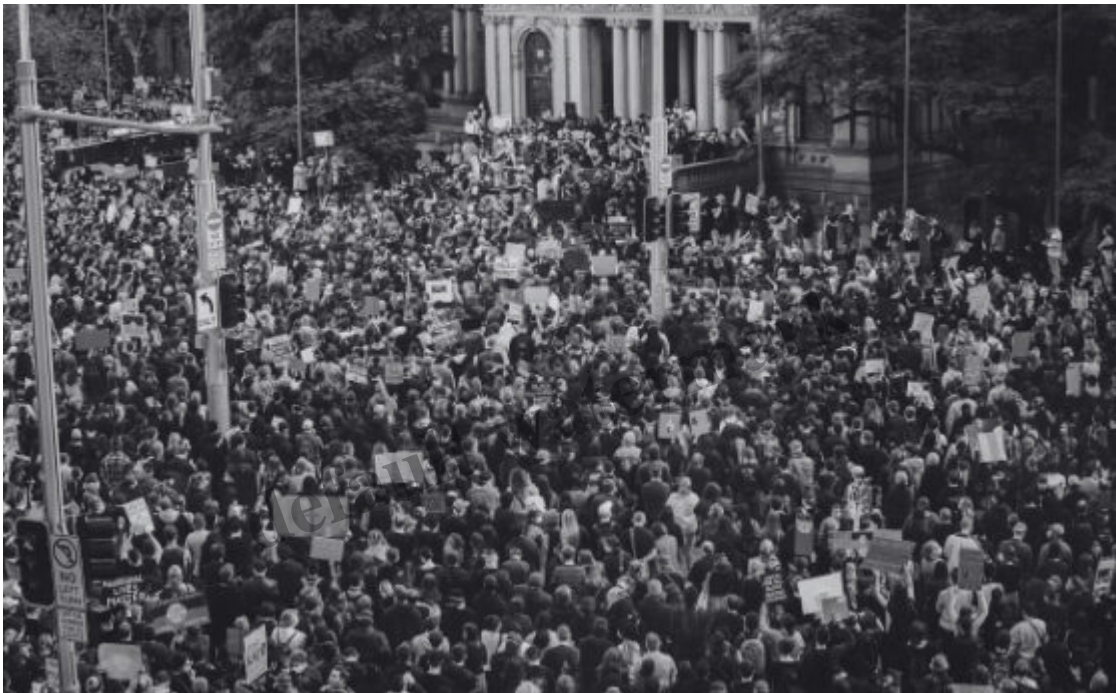

An April event is being organized now in honor of Dominic Davis, the 11-year-old who was recently shot and killed in the West End.

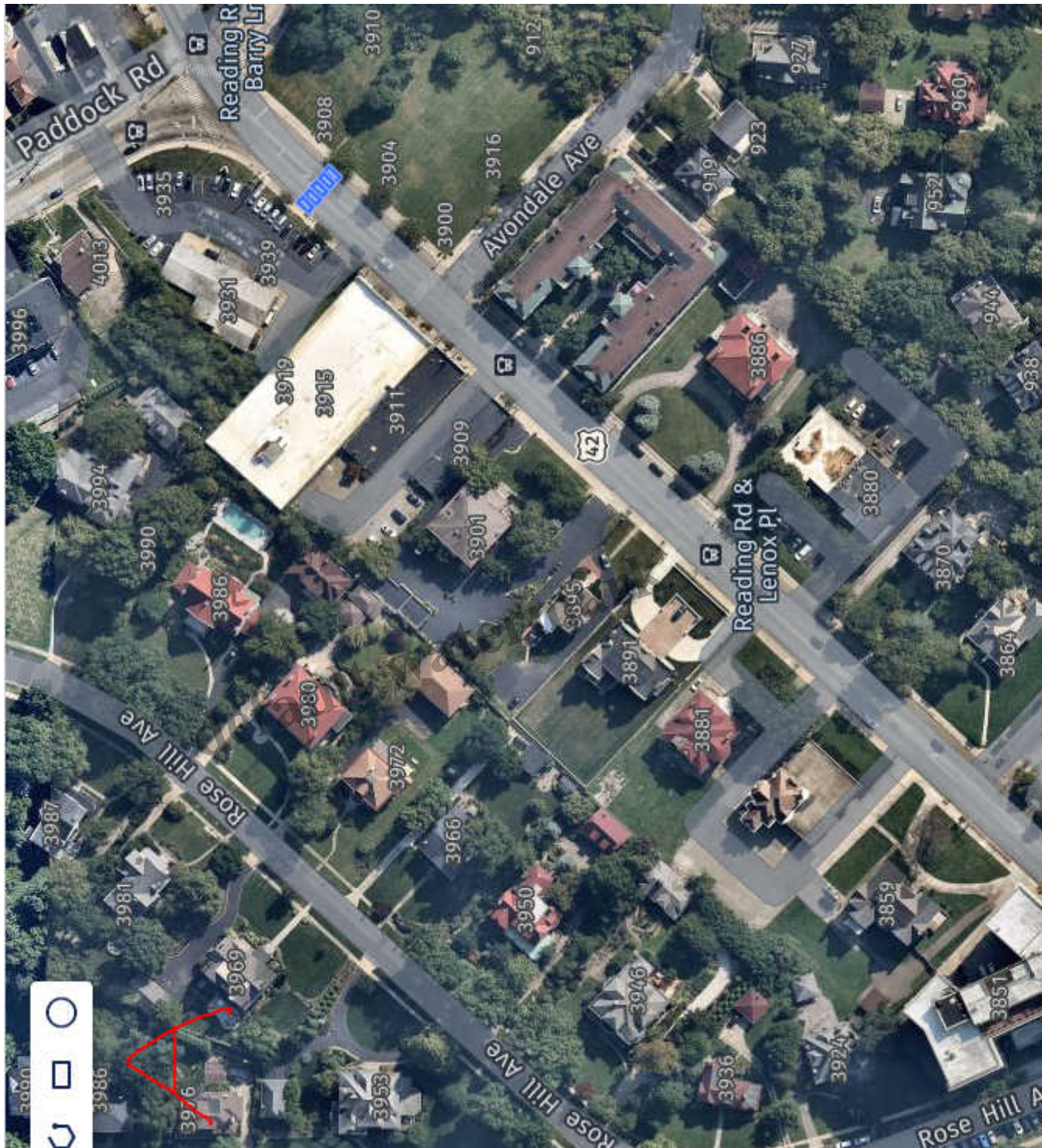
